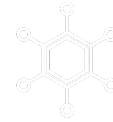

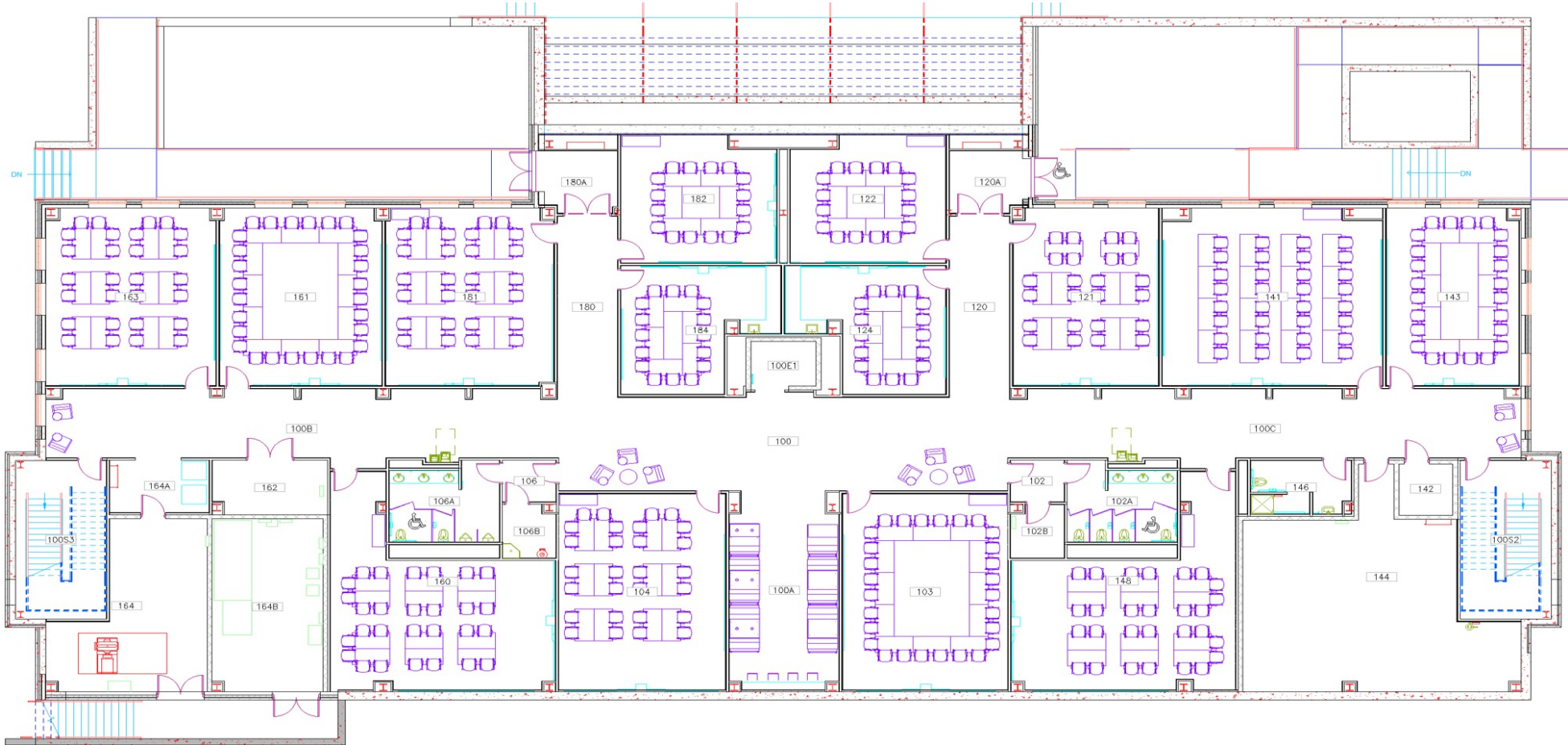
Building Hours

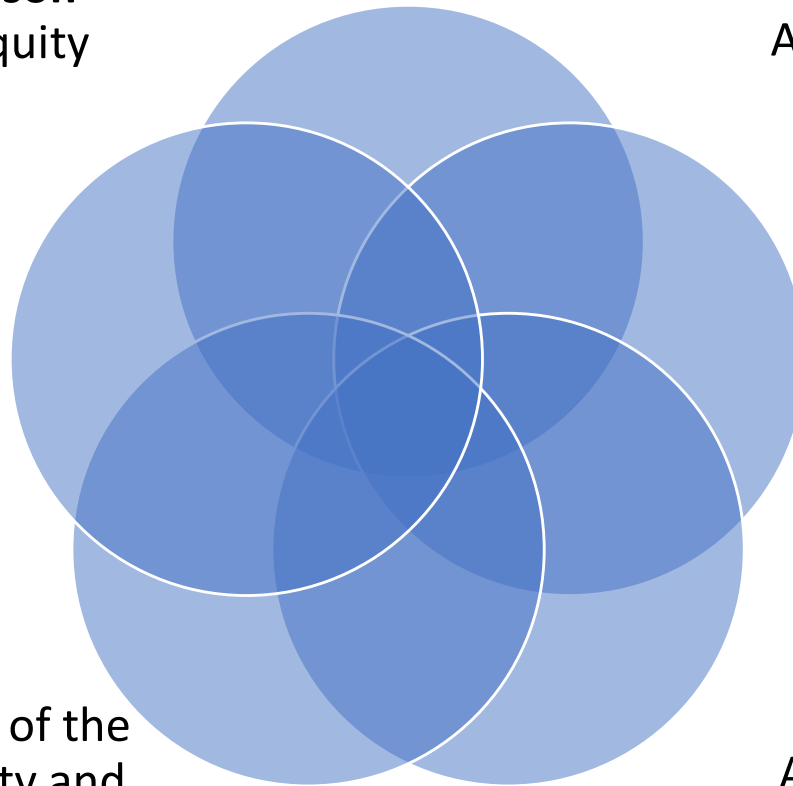
