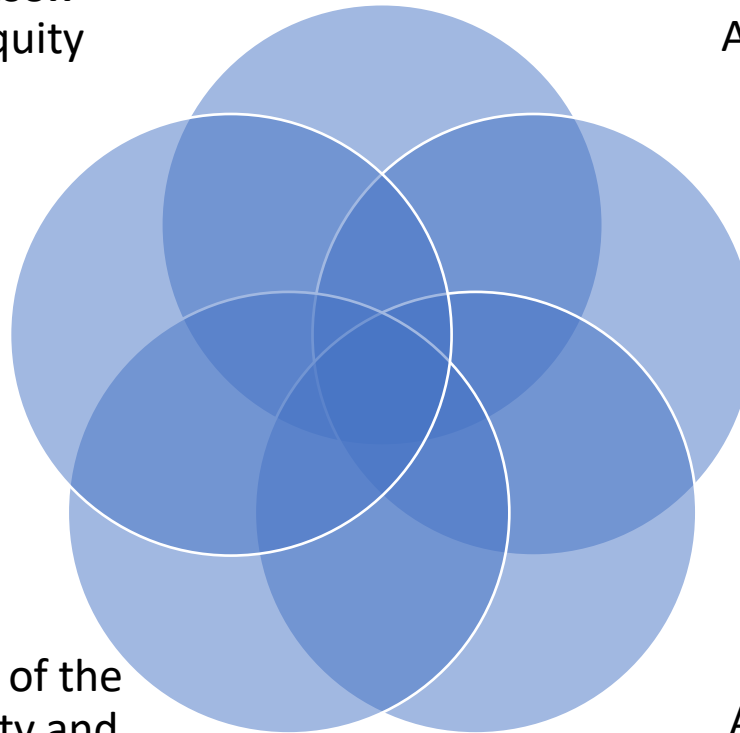

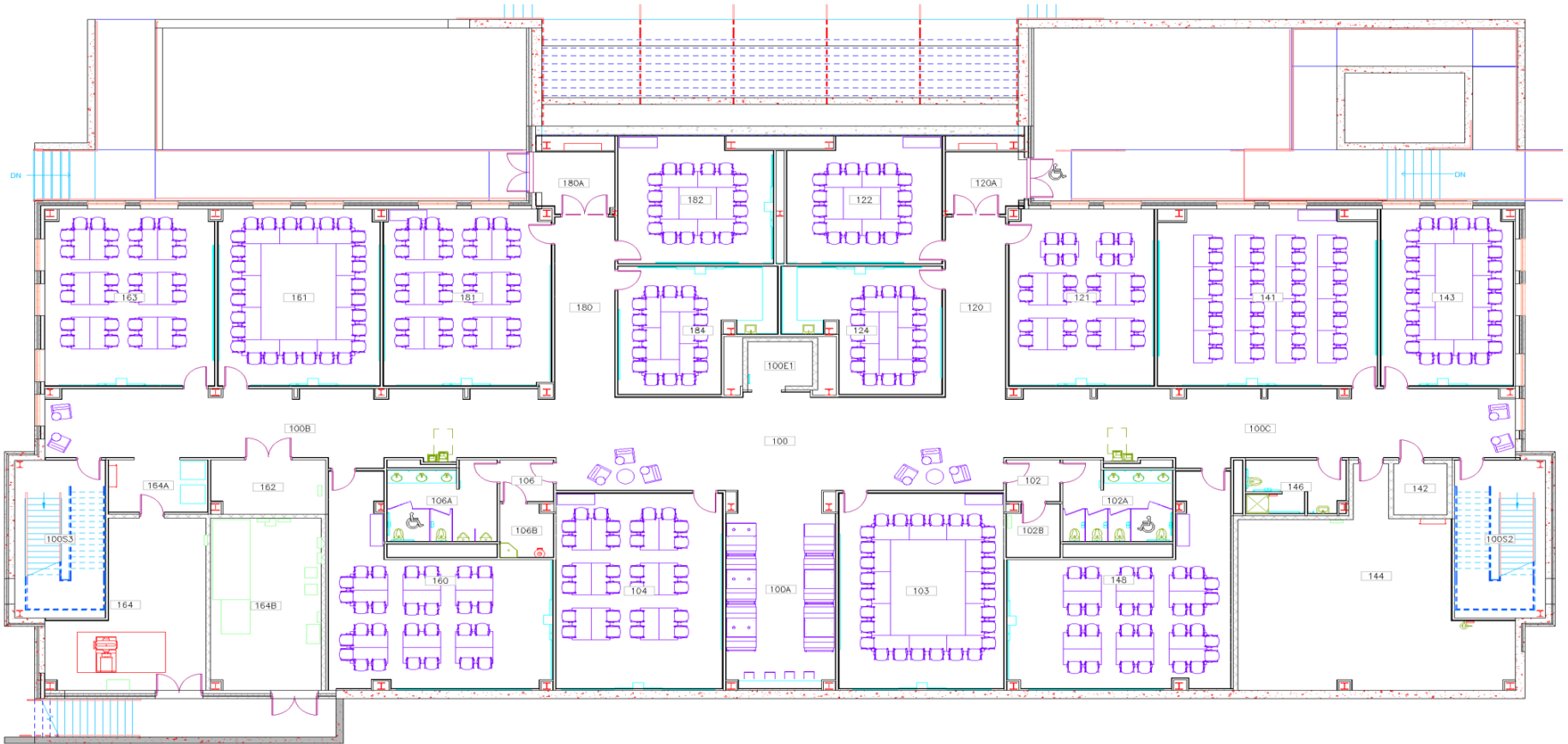
Building Hours

Title IX

- Enforced by the U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights.
- Protects people from discrimination based on sex, including sexual orientation and gender identity in education programs or activities that receive federal financial assistance.
- Under Title IX, sexual discrimination includes harassment on the basis of sex.

Verbal or written harassment

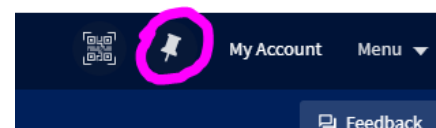

Reference (or citation) Management tools can help you keep track of your sources, and help you put your citations in your paper. You'll only need one:

- RefWorks - Lives in the cloud
- EndNote - Especially good if your research group/professors use it.
- Mendeley - works great if you have mostly pdfs in your research.
- Zotero - best one to use if you have a variety of kinds of sources: webpages, videos, images, pdfs and books. (<https://www.zotero.org/>)



Best tips from Eileen

- If you're not getting good results – it might be your search terms
- Use quotation marks around words to search as a phrase “addiction counseling”
- The introduction/literature review section of a good research article can help you understand the “landscape” of research.
- If you're stuck, email Eileen or make an [appointment!](#)

Workshops

- Child Abuse Identification
 - Only workshop that is required for ABA and Mental Health programs
- Safe Schools Against Violence in Education (SAVE)
- DASA (Dignity for All Students Act)
- Recommend to complete each workshop as soon as possible. Advisor will let you know if there are program-specific requirements about timing.
- Only have to take each workshop once
- Registration information can be found on our website
- Reminders sent via email each semester
- Student sends certificate of completion to certification@warner.rochester.edu
- Provider uploads certificate of completion to TEACH
 - The Office of Professions, for ABA and Mental Health licensure doesn't use the TEACH system, students need to retain the copy of the certificate of completion; will need for licensure



Child Abuse Identification Workshop

- Two-hour training in the identification and reporting of suspected child abuse and maltreatment.
- Required for:
 - students seeking New York State certification in teaching, school counseling, and administration.
 - students seeking New York State licensure in clinical mental health counseling and applied behavior analysis.
- Complete workshop at [NYS Office of Children and Family Services](#)
 - Register for an account and complete through their system
- Submit certificate of completion
- First became a requirement in February 1991.
- Updated requirements recently; Anyone graduating after April 1, 2025 will need new content



Fingerprint-Supported Background Check

- New York State requirement for:
 - certification applicants in teaching, counseling, and administration
 - anyone who is intending to work with children, either through ABA or CMHC licensure
- Complete your fingerprinting as soon as possible.
 - Many internships and student teaching placements cannot begin until fingerprinting has been complete.
- Fingerprinting done through Identogo: www.identogo.com .
 - Set up account
 - Answer questions related to citizenship, and other essential info.

SAVE Workshop

SAVE (Safe Schools Against Violence in Education) workshop:

- Required for students seeking New York State certification in teaching, school counseling, and administration.
- Opportunity to complete workshop through Genesee Valley BOCES
 - One-time registration fee covered for students matriculated in a program that leads to NYS certification or licensure.
 - Register for an account and complete through their system
 - Deadlines determined by your registration date
 - If you miss the deadline for course completion for any reason, you will be responsible for any subsequent registration costs
- Can choose to complete at any [NYS-approved provider](#)
- Submit certificate of completion
- Became a requirement in February 2001



DASA (Dignity For All Students Act) Workshop

- Six hours of training in Harassment, Bullying, Cyberbullying, and Discrimination in Schools: Prevention and Intervention
- Required for students seeking New York State certification in teaching, school counseling, and administration.
 - Opportunity to complete workshop through Genesee Valley BOCES
 - One-time registration fee covered for students matriculated in a program that leads to NYS certification or licensure.
 - Register for an account and complete through their system
 - Deadlines determined by your registration date
 - If you miss the deadline for course completion for any reason, you will be responsible for any subsequent registration costs
 - Two-part training:
 - Three-hour part I component
 - Confirmation of completion of all modules
 - Three-hour part II
 - Can complete at any [NYS-approved provider](#)
 - Submit certificate of completion
- Became a requirement in January 2014;
 - likely will need it if seeking a second certification
