

Title IX

- Enforced by the U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights.
- Protects people from discrimination based on sex, including sexual orientation and gender identity in education programs or activities that receive federal financial assistance.
- Under Title IX, sexual discrimination includes harassment on the basis of sex.

This can happen many ways including:

- Verbal or written harassment
- Sexual assault, including rape and other unwanted sexual touching,
- Stalking (when on the basis of sex)
- Dating or domestic violence

What do you need to do?

- All first-year undergraduate, graduate, and transfer students at the University are **required** to complete online training that covers Title IX prohibited behaviors, bystander intervention, how to report sexual violence, and how to connect to University, Rochester, or national resources. This training is administered online from Title IX staff utilizing Blackboard and is issued each fall and spring semester to all new students.
- Failure to complete this training by the due date results in a 'Title IX Training' hold placed onto the student's account which prohibits them from registering for classes.
